THE SOLICITORS ACTS 1954 TO 2008 (APPRENTICES' FEES) REGULATIONS 2008

The Law Society of Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Sections 5 and 82 of the Solicitors Act 1954 and with the concurrence of the President of the High Court hereby make the following Regulations:

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as The Solicitors Acts 1954 to 2008 (Apprentices' Fees) Regulations 2008.
- 2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of January 2009 and The Solicitors Acts, 1954 to 2002 (Apprentices' Fees) Regulations, 2007 (S.I. No. 809 of 2007) shall from that date stand revoked.
 - 3. (a) The words and phrases in these Regulations and in the Schedule hereto shall have the meanings respectively assigned by the Solicitors Acts 1954 to 2008 and, except insofar as may be inconsistent therewith, the provisions of the Solicitors Acts, 1954 to 1994 (Apprenticeship and Education) Regulations, 2001 (S.I. No. 546 of 2001).
 - (b) The Interpretation Act 2005 shall apply for the purposes of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the purposes of the interpretation of an Act of the Oireachtas, except insofar as it may be inconsistent with the provisions of the Solicitors Acts 1954 to 2002 or The Solicitors Acts, 1954 to 1994 (Apprenticeship and Education) Regulations, 2001 (S.I. No. 546 of 2001) or these Regulations.
- 4. As and from the date on which these Regulations shall come into operation, the fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall be paid to the Society in respect of courses and examinations provided for in The Solicitors Acts, 1954 to 1994 (Apprenticeship and Education) Regulations, 2001 (S.I. No. 546 of 2001).
